CoVID reminders:

If someone in your household is ill and being tested for CoVID, please do not send your children to childcare, school or sports practices.

Children and staff will be subject to the same guidelines put out by the Wisconsin Dept of Health and Public instruction in conjunction with the Marathon County Health Department. We will follow a checklist when deciding when to send children or staff home with an illness or to stay home with an illness. Please note, when a person has 2 or more of the symptoms on the checklist they are required to isolate at home for 10 days or have a negative CoVID test in order to return to school before the 10 days of isolation. **The Marathon County Health Department has instituted the sibling exclusion policy. Any sibling of a sick child whether in day school or childcare will need to stay home as well.**

Quarantine times for close contacts will remain at 14 days, unless the close contact has been vaccinated. If vaccinated, the close contact may return to school/childcare but will need to wear a mask until day 5 when they can be tested. If the vaccinated, close contact tests negative, they may remove the mask. If the vaccinated close contact chooses not to be tested, they will need to wear a mask for 14 days. If the vaccinated, close contact chooses not to wear a mask, then they will be subject to quarantine for 14 days.

Next week we will be having a "lockdown" drill. This drill simulates a situation in which an unwelcome and potentially harmful person or persons have entered our building and pose a threat to those inside. In our classrooms teachers have been talking to their students about the various types of drills we use in our school in an attempt to provide a safe environment for them when a crisis situation arises.
