GUIDELINES FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP

Safety Protocol for In-Person Worship

The following guidelines will be followed when in-person worship is reinstated at Trinity Lutheran Church:

- If you are sick or experiencing the following CoVID-19 or Flu-like symptoms, we ask that you would refrain from entering the building. CDC CoVID-19/Flu-like symptoms are as follows:
 - ♦ Cough
 ♦ Muscle pain
 - ♦ Fever ♦ Sore throat
 - ♦ Chills
 ♦ New loss of taste or smell
 - ♦ Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- We will continue to offer services online for the time being
- If you determine that you do not feel comfortable attending worship in-person, you are encouraged to attend online services
- All worship services will be held in the Upper Sanctuary at the following times: Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 8am,
 9:30am, and 11:00am. This change is to accommodate a greater occupancy and for cleaning purposes.
- For safety precautions, we ask that you refrain from gathering in the Narthex. We encourage you to wait in your vehicle until 5-10 minutes before service.
- Narthex-level restrooms will be open for visitor use. No other restrooms will be open
- For those with limited mobility, please park on Stewart Avenue and utilize the ramp
- Pastors will wash hands before and after services
- Hand sanitizers will be placed at all entrances and at the entrance of the Sanctuary
- Maximum attendance will be set at 150
- Maximum of 5 people per pew, except to accommodate an immediate family unit of greater than 5
- Social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet between people not living in the same household must be followed. Pastors will greet after service, but we ask that social distancing be maintained
- You are encouraged to come to your normal service time, and then leave when service is over. Please refrain from socializing before or after service
- Every other pew will be blocked off. Please refrain from sitting in blocked pews
- All hymnals, fellowship pads, pencils, and offering envelopes will be removed from the Sanctuary
- Frequently touched surfaces in the church (pews, door handles, railings, elevator buttons, cushions, etc.) will be sanitized after every service by Elders using specialized materials prepared by Custodial staff per OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Administration) guidelines
- Handouts, not full bulletins, will be prepared and left in the pews in advance of the service. Any handouts must be taken out of the building with you when leaving worship
- Non-worship gatherings (Coffee Hour, Sunday School, etc.) will continue to be suspended for the time being. An exception will be made for necessary Voters' Assemblies
- Solos may be sung, but we will continue to suspend Sanctuary Choir and Handbells
- Collection baskets will not be passed from person to person. The collection will be taken at the door and will not be left unattended
- No shaking of hands will take place
- Masks are optional

Communion Protocol

- Those preparing Communion will thoroughly wash hands
- Those distributing Communion will use hand sanitizer before and after distribution
- Communion will be by families/pews. An Usher will release each pew to avoid a line for Communion and to maintain social distancing between families
- For those who are uncomfortable attending in-person worship yet still desire the Sacrament of Holy Communion, please call the church office (715-842-0769) during the office hours of 7:00am-12:00pm to set up an appointment with a pastor

Regarding the Stewart Avenue steps repair, the Properties Ministry is presenting two options for a vote at a Special Assembly of the Voters on Sunday, July 26th.

June/ End of Fiscal Year Financial Summary

Here are the highlights from the June financials:

- Childcare was not open during the Safer-at-home orders. Families were not asked to continue paying for services they did not receive. This was a \$85,000 loss of income April-June.
- There are no outstanding balances for Day School Tuition.
- Tithes and Offerings were \$26,099 over budget for June. We end the 12th month of the fiscal year at **102**% of budgeted tithes and offerings for the year, \$23,641 more than budget and \$63,822 more than last year. This increase in tithes and offerings will help us to grow in ministry as we fully staff the Day School, the Pastoral offices, and prioritize the Director of Music position.
- We paid \$50,000 in ADDITIONAL principal on the June 2020 Thrivent loan payment!

Through the Safer-at-Home orders, we were able to maintain staff payroll at the usual rate due to the SBA PPP Loan that we obtained. Without that loan, we would have experienced a deficit to budget by about \$90,000. We were blessed to be able to care for our staff financially through this difficult experience. We are currently working on the Loan Forgiveness Application.

Budget was approved by the voters in the "Spring" Assembly on June 23rd. We worked very hard on this one to accommodate the many needs of ministry over the next 12 months, and it shows in the budget. The final version of the budget accounts for a new 8th grade teacher, a new Kindergarten teacher, a new 5th grade teacher, and a full time Director of Music. The budget is tight, but it serves Trinity in a way that positions us for growth of ministry.

Please pray continually for the future of Trinity – that we may be blessed to be a blessing to others in the community and beyond through a fruitful ministry to those we serve in the name of Jesus Christ. (John 15:5)

Human Resources

We will welcome new faces with the start of a new school year! God has blessed us with many gifts! Please pray for the transition of our incoming staff members and their families.

Katrina Erdman, a graduate of Trinity Lutheran School, will serve as our Kindergarten teacher. Katrina previously taught in Stevens Point, and she is excited to get started at Trinity.

Lissa Anklam will come back to Trinity and serve as the 5th grade teacher. Lissa has served in a substitute role in the Wausau School District for a number of years, but previously taught at Trinity for many years!

Tim Eigenfeld has accepted the Call as a teacher at Trinity's Middle School and will serve as the 8th grade homeroom teacher.

Matt Hoehne has accepted the Call as Trinity's Director of Music. Matt will begin his service at Trinity in early September.
