FROM THE PASTOR...

We begin with a Bible quiz. Ready...here goes—4 clues:

- +It was the first element God created (Genesis 1:3).
- +It was at the front and back of the Israelites in their march to the Promise Land (Exodus 13:21).
- +It was a defining identity for Christ (John 8:12a).
- +It is what Jesus shares with us...an essence of "life" (vs. 12b).

As you have likely guessed, we are talking about "light." It is a very common element in God's Word.

In God's design, it is preferred over darkness.

It is significant that Jesus is remarkably associated with light, especially in John's Gospel.

John starts right in the opening verses. In regard to Jesus, he said this—

"In him was life, and that life was the light of men ...The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it." (vs. 4 & 5)

"The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world." (vs.9)

Later in His ministry, Jesus validated these "light" claims—

"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (8:12)

Darkness is the antithesis of light. In a spiritual context, darkness is the contrast between living in sin (Satan's domain), rather than in living in righteousness (right before Christ).

The apostle Paul reflects on this positioning in his letter to the Ephesians—

"For you were once darkness, but now you are the light of the Lord. Live as children of the light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) and find out what pleases the Lord. Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose them. For it is shameful even to mention what the disobedient do in secret. But everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for it is light that makes everything visible."

(5:8-14a; also see 1 John 1:5-9)

Oh the joy we find in Christ...and His light.
In His plan, we can walk in that light all the way to heaven's glory with Him!
Let His light shine through you!

The Five Finger Prayer



Facilities/Properties

We are on the contractor's schedule for the roof/steeples/louver work! Weather permitting, we will start as early as March. Once the work begins, it should take about 8 weeks...since we all know how that goes, we are budgeting to have this work done by mid-Summer. Trinity is getting a face lift, and it is very exciting.

December Financial Summary

As of October, we were coming in at 90% of budgeted Tithes and Offerings...however, after November and December, we are at 97% of Tithes and Offerings for the first ½ of the fiscal year. Many of the Tithes and Offerings came in the way of IRA minimum qualified distributions.

If you have a retirement account, and someone helps you manage that, ask them about the tax benefit of IRA minimum qualified distributions and gifts to non-profits. This has been a huge blessing for Trinity, so thank you to all of you who have directed these distributions to us. We are working hard to be good stewards of your generosity.

We continue to be good stewards. This is evident in the bottom line – we continue to perform very well to budget. We anticipate meeting budget this year...that would be the second year in a row! We also feel confident that we can accommodate the Music Director position with the projected surplus. If we continue to move along this trend in giving and stewardship, we are going to be able to make a larger impact in ministry. We have truly come a long way from where we were a few years ago.

We received the minimum distribution on the extended loan terms in December. Until May, we must make interest only payments. However, we are planning to make the budgeted principal payments from Jan-May when we make the May payment. In addition, we will apply a significant amount of Debt Reduction donations as additional principal at that time. Look for a report of balances at that time.

Please pray continually for the future of Trinity – that we may be blessed to be a blessing to others in the community and beyond through a fruitful ministry to those we serve in the name of Jesus Christ. (John 15:5)

Human Resources

John Burns has chosen not to negotiate his contract with Trinity following this school year. As a result, we have assembled a Call Committee for the 8th grade teaching position. Please pray for John and his family through this transition, and please pray for the Call Committee process, that God's will be done, and that our students be blessed with another Middle School Teacher who can carry on the legacy of Christian Education at Trinity.

The Director of Music Call Committee continues to seek a qualified candidate. Please keep the committee in your prayers as they continue that process.
