





"A Devotional Thought For Our Daily Remembrance in the New Year 2021"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If I were to ask you whose birthday did we celebrate the past month on December 25th? No doubt you would say, "It was Jesus Christ's birthday!" That is so true, but for me also, I could say it was my cousin Carol's birthday on the 25th...no doubt there are others that can claim that day also as their birthday. Yet how many have focused on the worldly aspects of Christmas...the decorations, the family gatherings, the gifts, and the Christmas carols. For so many, it was "our day," and the true meaning of Christ's birth is pushed into the background...especially now with the continued fear of the CoVID-19 virus. It may be easy for us to say Christmas was Christ's day—His birthday—and then focus on the personal involvements of family and friends.

There is the example of a pastor visiting in the home of some friends on Christmas Day. He expected to find every-one happy and joyful. 

Facilities/Properties

Although the Stewart Avenue Step project is fully funded, the project has been put on hold at least until after Christmas due to delays caused by CoVID at the materials level. This is a great exercise in patience for members and staff who have contributed so much effort to see this project through each phase.

We have started a Building Restoration Fund that members can donate to as we look to the future needs of the church.

We continue to carry out disinfection protocols every day after school and church to insure the safety of our staff, students and visitors. Extra measures have also been implemented in childcare. We are using non-toxic cleaning materials when possible to reduce exposure to potentially harmful chemicals. All cleaning materials that we are using have been researched and are on record with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to kill human coronavirus according to Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines.

November Financial Summary

The new Chart of Accounts is finally completed, and we are confident that there are little to no errors. It looks dramatically different, and this has simplified the financials for the congregation, the administrative staff, and the auditors. We will make every effort to continue to be transparent, but **for one year there will be no comparison data from year over year**. This is because the accounts are so different, it would be immensely difficult to show true comparisons.

Highlights for November financials include the following:

- We are falling about 8% short of budget for tithes and offerings. This is mildly concerning as we close out November. Typically, we would see an increase in giving in November, but this year it was not a remarkable increase. We will have to consider this during the new budget cycle, which will begin in early 2021 as we plan for the next year.
- Childcare is operating at 53% of budgeted income (down from last month) due to CoVID. This has a big impact on the bottom line and is in process of being evaluated.
- We are under budget for expenses...we continue to be good stewards of the resources we are given.
- We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:
 - Endowment Loan: \$149,844
 - Thrivent Loan: \$661,198 (We budgeted to pay additional principal this year, but since our income is lower than expected, we will start paying only the required principal/interest.)
 - TOTAL Debt: \$811,042

PPP Loan Update:

In April, we applied for and received a Payroll Protection Program loan from the Small Business Association in the amount of \$227,600. The purpose of that "forgivable" loan was to provide relief during the Stay-At-Home period, when continued income was unpredictable. Because of the loan, we were able to continue providing income and benefits for all of our staff during that 8-week period.

We were able to apply for loan forgiveness in September. The SBA had 90 days to review our application and determine if any of our loan could be forgiven. We are so blessed! We found out in early November that 100% of our PPP Loan was forgiven, which means that we don't have to pay any of it back! Some of that money is covering the loss that we are experiencing in child-care as a result of families staying home due to lost jobs, working from home, etc. Some of that money is covering ongoing operations as a result of lower Tithes and Offerings than we budgeted. Some of the money has been spent on salaries and benefits that fell outside of the 8-week eligible expense period. Some of that money is being spent as staff members must stay home for CoVID-related care or quarantine. We are in process of evaluating what portion of that money remains and how it is best served in ministry.

Overall we should be in a good financial position to budget, but we will have a better picture of this after Christmas. Our finances are a reflection of the overall health and generosity of our congregation.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Did you know...School enrollment continued to grow, and already in 1922, just seven short years after the construction of and expanding the school into Meyer's School, there was need for more classroom space. There was a Methodist chapel next door and to the south of Meyer's School, and it was decided to rent the building for \$25 per month. The third and fourth grade students were moved into the building, and the school occupied the chapel until the construction of a new school building in 1925. The Methodist Chapel was eventually converted into apartments and then in 1996 was purchased by Trinity and later demolished with the expansion of our current school building in

1997. ...now you know!

Did you know... When rent for the Methodist Chapel was raised from \$25 per month to \$30 per month, serious discussion started about consolidating the school into one building that at the time was conducting classes in three separate buildings. On January 4, 1925 the congregation authorized the building of a new school, and a building committee was appointed. The architects were Oppenheimer and Obel of Wausau and Green Bay, and the contractor was Mr. F.W. Krause, president of the congregation at the time, who until then had built most of the schools in Wausau. Groundbreaking was held on May 24, 1925, the cornerstone was laid on July 12, 1925 and the new school was dedicated on January 31, 1926. The total cost of the building was \$85,000, and in order to fund the construction there was an assessment of \$100 per voting member. Following the demolition of the building in 1983 the original cornerstone of the 1925 school was salvaged and reseated in the wall near the main entrance to the current gymnasium. ...now you know!
