



LETTER TO THE CONGREGATION: RETURN TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

Members, Families and Friends of Trinity Lutheran Church and School:

Grace, mercy and peace be unto you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The Psalmist writes in Psalm 84:1-2, "How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts! My soul longs, yes, faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God." I am sure you all can resonate. Throughout the past several months, I have truly longed to gather in worship and take Communion with the church family. With the recent decision by the Supreme Court of Wisconsin, I am sure you all are wondering when we will gather in the courts of the Lord's house at Trinity. Well, I have good news! It is time to break our fast and return home!

After much prayer, deliberation, and consultation with other LCMS pastors in Marathon County, the Board of Elders, Pastor Holdorf and Pastor Smith have made the following decisions pertaining to public gatherings for worship at Trinity Lutheran Church:

- 1. Public gathering for worship will begin again the weekend of May 30-31 with Holy Communion at all services. We will offer worship at the following service times: Saturdays at 5:00pm and Sundays at 8:00am, 9:30am, and 11:00am. Please note that things will be different when we gather.
- 2. With the continued threat of CoVID-19, strict guidelines will be in place when we gather for worship to ensure the safety of God's people. For more details, please carefully read the attached guidelines. All plans will be continually reviewed, and further updates will follow if necessary.
- 3. All other church activities are suspended until further notice. This includes Sunday School, Coffee Hour, all adult gatherings (Joy, Blind Outreach), youth groups, all small groups, rentals at the church, and all Bible classes (Sunday and Wednesday).
- 4. Bible Studies and Devotions will be offered on our Facebook page: Trinity Lutheran Church and School-Wausau and our YouTube channel Trinity Lutheran Wausau. Daily Banter will change to Weekly Banter, offered Thursdays at 10:00am on Facebook Live.
- 5. With the continual fluidity of the situation, we will focus on delivering our communication to the congregation via social media and e-mail. If you find that you are not receiving communication via e-mail please contact the church office (info@trinitynet.org or 715-842-0769).

Even though things will look different, we will soon be able to sing together, "I will offer to you the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the LORD. I will pay my vows to the LORD in the presence of all his people, in the courts of the house of the LORD, in your midst, O Jerusalem. Praise the LORD!" (Psalm 116:17-19)

GUIDELINES FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP

Safety Protocol for In-Person Worship

The following guidelines will be followed when in-person worship is reinstated at Trinity Lutheran Church:

- If you are sick or experiencing the following CoVID-19 or Flu-like symptoms, we ask that you would refrain from entering the building. CDC CoVID-19/Flu-like symptoms are as follows:
 - ♦ Cough

♦ Muscle pain

♦ Fever

♦ Sore throat

♦ Chills

- ♦ New loss of taste or smell
- ♦ Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- We will continue to offer services online for the time being
- If you determine that you do not feel comfortable attending worship in-person, you are encouraged to attend online services
- All worship services will be held in the Upper Sanctuary at the following times: Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 8am, 9:30am, and 11:00am. This change is to accommodate a greater occupancy and for cleaning purposes.
- For safety precautions, we ask that you refrain from gathering in the Narthex. We encourage you to wait in your vehicle until 5-10 minutes before service.
- Narthex-level restrooms will be open for visitor use. No other restrooms will be open
- For those with limited mobility, please park on Stewart Avenue and utilize the ramp
- Pastors will wash hands before and after services
- Hand sanitizers will be placed at all entrances and at the entrance of the Sanctuary
- Maximum attendance will be set at 150
- Maximum of 5 people per pew, except to accommodate an immediate family unit of greater than 5
- Social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet between people not living in the same household must be followed. Pastors will greet after service, but we ask that social distancing be maintained
- You are encouraged to come to your normal service time, and then leave when service is over. Please refrain from socializing before or after service
- Every other pew will be blocked off. Please refrain from sitting in blocked pews
- All hymnals, fellowship pads, pencils, and offering envelopes will be removed from the Sanctuary
- Frequently touched surfaces in the church (pews, door handles, railings, elevator buttons, cushions, etc.) will be sanitized
 after every service by Elders using specialized materials prepared by Custodial staff per OSHA (Occupational Safety and
 Health Administration) guidelines
- Handouts, not full bulletins, will be prepared and left in the pews in advance of the service. Any handouts must be taken out of the building with you when leaving worship
- Non-worship gatherings (Coffee Hour, Sunday School, etc.) will continue to be suspended for the time being. An exception will be made for necessary Voters' Assemblies
- Solos may be sung, but we will continue to suspend Sanctuary Choir and Handbells
- Collection baskets will not be passed from person to person. The collection will be taken at the door and will not be left unattended
- No shaking of hands will take place
- Masks are optional

Communion Protocol

- Those preparing Communion will thoroughly wash hands
- Those distributing Communion will use hand sanitizer before and after distribution
- Communion will be by families/pews. An Usher will release each pew to avoid a line for Communion and to maintain social distancing between families
- For those who are uncomfortable attending in-person worship yet still desire the Sacrament of Holy Communion, please call the church office (715-842-0769) during the office hours of 7:00am-12:00pm to set up an appointment with a pastor

MISSION IN NICARAGUA UPDATE

Important Update on Trinity School's Mission in Nicaragua

The students at Trinity have been supporting jungle schools in Nicaragua for the past 6 years. They have already made a huge impact on 37 different schools and over 1600 students. The people of Nicaragua are living in troubled times, not just from the CoVID-19 virus but from a government that is suppressing freedoms and forcing socialism on its people. Pensions for retirees have had major cuts, citizens have been taxed above their means, and land owned by many has just been taken away. Those protesting and fighting for their rights are killed or imprisoned. The following is a letter from Francisco Oporta to Trinity students and teachers:

Dear friends,

Thanks to God Katherine and I are well and our families too. The Nicaraguan government reports 16 cases of CoVID-19 and 6 deaths, but this is not real information because they are hiding the real numbers. Many epidemiologists believe that there are about 300 cases. Here in Nicaragua, no border has been closed, and people are still working, because the government's orientation is that all companies and public institutions work normally, but there are many businesses closed.

As you know in 2018 we had a political crisis and now CoVID-19 is the second crisis. This has destroyed the economy. More than 100,000 employees have been laid off. Schools continue to operate, but attendance is at 70%. There are many parents who do not send their children as a precaution. Closing schools here is difficult because most families do not have telephones and there is no electricity.

I still work for the same organization, but I have been moved to other duties. Now I am the coordinator of a project that serves 39 schools. My work is focused on pedagogical advice and teacher training. Again, I am visiting the local schools. I like to do that because this way I am closer to the children and teachers.

A thousand thanks to the children of Trinity School for their great effort. Each penny they donate is very well used to meet the needs of many children from marginalized communities. As I told you last year, I think we should continue to buy school supplies, which is the greatest need. With these economic crises there are many children who are not studying because their parents do not have money to buy school supplies. For this year, the purpose is to benefit 10 new schools. Attached I am sending the list of schools and budget proposal. Regarding the transfer, I think it is best to use the same account as last year to avoid using my personal account and thus the government does not accuse me.

Bring my regards to Trinity teachers and students. Thanks for supporting our kids in Nicaragua.

This year, thanks to a Penny War by the students at Trinity, Francisco will receive about \$1600. Francisco's budget that he had enclosed proposes spending \$300 for Bibles, \$400 for religious books, and \$900 for school supplies. There is no money left over to buy any textbooks for teachers or students. If you wish to contribute to Trinity School's mission, you can do so at the school office. Guidelines for Childcare after Safer at Home Order

Individuals should NOT enter Trinity if:

- You are showing symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, or shortness of breath).
- You have been in contact with someone confirmed or suspected of having COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

Check in Procedures:

- For Rainbow, Butterfly and Sonshine Classrooms enter the building using the main doors (#1) into the main lobby. Little Lambs enter building by classroom outside door. Please only one person enter/exit at a time to help with social distancing.
- The outside main doors #1 will be open from 7:00 am to 12:00 pm Monday through Friday. These are the new summer office hours for the church and school offices. For the hours of 6:30-7:00 am and 12:00 pm-6:00 pm your security badge will unlock the outside main door #1 and unlock the inside security doors. The scanner is the black box on the railing by the main doors. Place your security badge on the scanner and the door will unlock. You must have your security badge to gain access to the building when the front office is closed. If you do not have your badge and the front office is closed, you may call your child's classroom. The entire class will have to come and open the door for you, as a teacher cannot leave the children unattended, and children cannot come by themselves to open the door. There will be a fee charged for not having your badge and needing the door opened for you.
- All children will have their temperature taken before allowed to stay at the center.
- Children will wash their hands and parents/guardians will wash hands or use hand sanitizer upon entering the classroom.
- Parents/Guardians must sign children in on the clipboard with the time and your printed name. It is crucial that
 this is done as record for who and when people are in the building. This will be a record for attendance along
 with contact tracing if needed for COVID-19 exposure.
- When leaving use separate exit door from the classroom.
- When leaving the building, exit out by the Spiritual Life Center Doors—not through the main lobby from where
 you entered. Little Lambs exit out through the outside classroom door. Please only one person exit/enter at a
 time to help with social distancing.

Meal/Snack Time:

- Cold lunch required as no hot lunch program is available. Please label lunch box and have an ice pack, utensils
 and something to drink included.
- Please bring a labeled water bottle for your child.
- Children will eat in their classrooms.

Nap Time:

• Space between sleep mats and cribs will be increased as much as possible.

Check Out Procedures:

- For Rainbow, Butterfly and Sonshine Classrooms enter the building using the main doors (#1) into the main lobby. Little Lambs enter building by classroom outside door. Please only one person enter/exit at a time to help with social distancing.
- The outside main doors #1 will be open from 7:00 am to 12:00 pm Monday through Friday. These are the new summer office hours for the church and school offices. For the hours of 6:30-7:00 am and 12:00 pm-6:00 pm your security badge will unlock the outside main door #1 and unlock the inside security doors. The scanner is the black

 with contact tracing if needed for COVID-19 exposure.
- When leaving use separate exit door from the classroom.
- When leaving the building exit out by the Spiritual Life Center Doors. Not through the main lobby from where you entered. Little Lambs exit out through the outside classroom door. Please only one person exit/enter at a time to help with social distancing.

Illness Policy Temporary Changes:

- If your child has a fever of 100.0 degrees or higher they must be out of childcare for **72 hours** after the fever is gone without the aid of fever reducing medicine.
- If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, or shortness of breath) while in our care, you will be called for an immediate pick up.
- All children in the same family will be sent home and be out of childcare for the same time as the ill child.

Increased Sanitation and Hygiene Practices:

- Practice frequent handwashing
- Advise children, families and staff to avoid touching their eyes, nose and mouth with their hands.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, pens, toilets, faucets and sinks.
- During naptime toys, shelves and play areas will be disinfected.
- Please note that even with these new guidelines in place there is no guarantee to be able to protect you or your child 100% from the Coronavirus or any other contagious illness.



JOY (JUST OLDER YOUTH)

A Lifelong Journey...Are You Still Growing? In Your Faith?

No doubt for many of us, the present CoVID pandemic "has...is...and will" continue to affect our daily lives to one degree or another. At the same time, God's Word in the Holy Scriptures not only gives us a foundation stone for our daily lives, but it continues to call each one of us, young and old, to grow in our faith (see Mark 4:38-40). This spiritual growth is basic to our God-given calling to live out our faith in the good and the troubled times of our lives. There is no sense of retirement from living lives of discipleship in our daily journey with God and one another. Empowered by the caring love of our Heavenly Father, the forgiving and saving love of our Savior Jesus Christ, and the empowering presence of the Holy Spirit, we are called to be active disciples of Almighty God (Matthew 28:18-20). Do you believe that following Jesus is a way of life? This calls for a way of life no matter what the circumstances... "an intentional commitment."

It leads to a deepening love for God and one another! It means intentionally being "faithful lifelong students" giving God the glory in our thoughts, words, and actions. Granted we live in a very troubled and fear-filled world, we daily hear God's promise: "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want...He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake...Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me...Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Psalm 23). Even though we live in troubled and uncertain times, I pray all of us will understand that "maturing in our faith and growing in Christ takes a lifetime."

Martin Luther describes the life of faith as the journey rather than the destination; we are always on the way: "This life, therefore, is not godliness but the process of becoming godly, not health but getting well, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not now what we shall be, but we are on the way. The process is not yet finished, but is actively going on. This is not the goal but it is the right road. At present, everything does not gleam and sparkle, but everything is being cleansed." The challenges in our earthly journey may sometimes seem overwhelming, but each day is an opportunity to live our "faith walk" hand-in-hand with our Good Shepherd (Psalm 118:24), for all things work together for good to those who love and follow the Lord.



How to Create an online SCRIP Account (5-10 min) – STEP by STEP

- Go to Church Office and meet with Nancy or Jenna
- Nancy or Jenna can retrieve your username and add your preferred email
- Go to www.shopwithscrip.com
 - 0 Enter username
 - 0 Click "I've forgotten my password"
 - 0 Enter your email address
- Check email for temporary password (possibly in your junk mail!!)
- Click email link to shopwithscrip
 - 6 Enter username and answer two security questions
 - Change password to something you will remember
 - 0 Enter cell phone # and select "text" or "call"
 - Send code-Verification code will be sent to your phone
 - 0 Enter verification code-Submit

Set up PrestoPay (for ACH withdrawal from your checking account) This takes about 10 minutes, and processes in 2-3 days

- Go to Dashboard (top right)

 - Enter deposit amounts into PrestoPay to verify the correct account
 - Choose a 4-digit PIN number that you will remember and enter it twice
 - Retrieve PrestoPay approval code WRITE IT DOWN! You will have to give this code to Church Office! If you skip this part and pass the code, you can find it again by going to Dashboard-Family Functions--PrestoPay



 - Trinity gets better rebates from some local vendors, as compared to shopwithscrip purchases...so if you buy something online that we carry at Trinity, YOU are getting the online published rebate *instead* of the rebate we offer at Trinity.

Facilities/Properties

In my last article I reported that the steeples were complete, expecting the work to be completed by the time the newsletter was printed. However, that was not the case due to a stall in progress with CoVID-19. The west steeple was completed with a "gold" tone hip cap and steeple ornament. While we were not expecting the "gold" tone, the Properties Ministry decided to seek feedback from the Ministerial/Administrative Staff and the Board of Lay Ministry before making any changes. Ultimately, the decision was made to continue with the gold-toned stainless steel on both steeples. The gold tone was found to be striking, drawing the eye up. They will last for generations to come with very little maintenance.

We are still working towards the Stewart Avenue steps repair. We have a few options to present to the congregation, but all involved tearing out existing foundation under the planters and steps to reinforce them. This is a more extensive project than what we first imagined. When we can meet again as a congregation, we will hold a Voters' Assembly for several reasons – this project will be presented at that time so that the congregation can advise us on how to move forward.

April Financial Summary

Ending the tenth month of the fiscal year, we are currently at **99%** of tithes and offerings budgeted. We have been so blessed by a responsive congregation through CoVID-19. You continue to support the operations of the church, which allows us to continue to serve you through different means of print, social media, and digital communication, even when we are not practicing in the building. THANK YOU for your dedication to the ministry at Trinity Lutheran Church and School.

We are operating at a gain for the fiscal year when compared to last year...by about \$30,000. That is a very positive financial note. We seem to have overcome financial hurdles that we were facing a couple of years ago. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

We continue to work on the budget process through virtual meetings. Parish Council, as representatives of the congregation, will likely approve a budget contingent upon voter approval at a later date. Due to participation in the School Choice program, Day School must have an approved budget by June 30th.

The latest version of the budget, which will be presented to the voters at the next available opportunity, accounts for a new 8th grade teacher, a new Kindergarten teacher, and a full time Director of Music.

Please pray continually for the future of Trinity – that we may be blessed to be a blessing to others in the community and beyond through a fruitful ministry to those we serve in the name of Jesus Christ (John 15:5).
