Dear Trinity,

In this time of chaos and fear, we often forget the promises that God has offered or given to us. As we live in quarantine for a few weeks longer, we have the opportunity to meditate on God's Word as we never have before. In light of that reality, let us look at some of the various promises God has given to us.

One promise that we find throughout Scripture is the promise of peace. Philippians 4 says, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." This is not always easy for us to do, as anxiety can attack us from any angle, at any time, especially when we are worried about our livelihoods, our families, and our county, but God has promised to take care of us. Matthew 6 says "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you?" God has promised to take care of us, and does not wish for us to be anxious, or to worry about anything, and while it is often difficult to actually live in this way, God has promised us ultimate peace when he returns to take us home.

Speaking of that promise, let's look at 1 Thessalonians 4 in which the Apostle Paul writes, "For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words." We will live with the Lord forever and ever. Revelation tells us there will be no more suffering, no more weeping, no more sin, and no more death. We will live in eternal peace and joy with the Lord always. God himself, Christ himself has promised us this, and it is going to be awesome. It is going to be beyond anything we have words to describe.

Finally, it is always a good thing to remember that God's promises apply to each and every one of us. How do we know this? Well, we were baptized of course. Paul writes again in Romans 6 saying, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." God's promise of eternal life, of eternal peace is real for each and every one of us because that promise was given to us when the water was poured over our heads and the Word was spoken to us. You and I have the promises of God on our side—COVID-19 has nothing but a short-lived chaotic moment that is already passing away. May we always celebrate the promises of God, and never forget that despite all of the worries, and all of the woes that we have in this life, God is still with us, still taking care of us, and has promised us eternal life in everlasting peace with Him forever. I pray that these verses help you remember the promises that God has given each and every one of you.

Greetings in Christ and Blessed Eastertide!

Lord, have mercy. The part of all this that hurts the most is being separated from the church and His Holy Supper. I know some people say the church is the people and not a building, but I, like many of you, long to return to the House of the Lord. Psalm 26:8 says, "O Lord, I love the habitation of Your house and the place where your glory dwells." We chant this beautiful verse threefold in the Order of Matins following the readings from Holy Scripture. I guess in the midst of this all we get a sliver of what it must have been like for the Israelites when the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed and they were sent into exile. May the Lord bring us back to His House soon, and in the meantime may he create in us a deep hunger for His Word and His Supper that we might never take it for granted again.

Now for some updates on ministry. Confirmation instruction has been suspended and most likely concluded for the year. This should actually be okay. I had just finished up our final unit and was ready to start our review unit which usually closes out the year with our 8th grade class. Just missing the review unit is not too big of a deal. Our 7th grade class will not be able to finish out their instruction this year, but will be receiving instruction from us in the catechism again next year as 8th grade students, so I believe we will be fine there as well. The Rite of Confirmation Service is scheduled for Saturday, May 16th. It was my prayer that we could still make this happen if the restrictions were eased or lifted after April 30th. The possibility of that is now looking very bleak. If we are unable to have the service, I would recommend that we reschedule it in October on Reformation Day, which is also customary in the Lutheran church. In the meantime, students are still being expected to complete their requirements for this year (sermon reports, memory work, serve in vocation form and capstone projects). I am having parents and students email me their homework and assignments.

Early Communion Classes could be rescheduled for some time in May, but if not, I think we could offer the classes in the fall of 2020 and try and avoid summer. Worst case scenario would be to wait and include the students in next year's classes.

I intend to resume our Youth Group nights as soon as we are able. We are really missing the fellowship and Christian growth that those nights provide.

I have created an Instagram account for Youth At Trinity in addition to our Facebook page. Instagram is a more popular social media platform with teens right now. I am using these social media tools to provide Bible readings, questions and reflections to our youth in the absence of our Youth Nights. A postcard went out a couple weeks ago to all students in 7th -12th grade that provided information on how to subscribe and stay in touch with us and God's Word.

I am also working to provide our church services and the pastors' "Daily Banter" on our Facebook page and our YouTube channel. Our services continue to be shown on Public Access as always. I can also provide a DVD or jump drive of our services to those who do not have internet or cable television. Please let me know if you know of someone who needs one, and I will find a way to get it to them.

These can be scary times. Jesus says to His scared disciples in John 14:1 "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me." May God's promises extinguish in us all fears of body, mind and spirit. Haven't you heard? As the beautiful Easter hymn proclaims: "The strife is o'er, the battle done; Now is the victor's triumph won; Now be the song of praise begun. Alleluia!"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! I pray you are doing well. Life has its challenges for all of us each new day, but we are never alone! Daily we can praise God with the psalmist of the Old Testament in Psalm 118:24 (P.S. a favorite passage of mine)... "This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it." Those words are easy to say, but do we really believe they are true? When you and I look around our world today and try to face life, it can be difficult and sometimes discouraging. Our world needs to hear the saving message of Law and Gospel. For each one of us, I would recommend that we pay attention to the prescription of a wise Doctor. I am not referring to a medical doctor but to the simple reminder of Dr. Martin Luther in John 3:16, "God so loved the world..." This is the ultimate source of "Good News." The Lord God knows what He is doing as our lives and activities have been changed with more limitations. We just trust and take one day at a time, giving God the glory and praise. I am sorry my letter was so long...but maybe it is like a sermon...not knowing when to stop! And finally a special "thank you" to the many members of our church family who have been so kind and encouraging. God's special blessings to each of you!

TRINITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL

Hello Trinity families!

As you might expect, our world here at Trinity has been turned upside down by the coronavirus and the governor shutting things down for the school year. It caused us all (teachers, staff, parents, and students) to make quick adjustments to how we look at things and handle things. But, that being said, school still goes on. I want to thank everyone mentioned above for doing a great job in making a change in their routine and life to make the best out of a situation that is far from ideal.

School continues to move forward as scheduled on our calendar, and the staff is looking for ways that we might still be able to make some things like our Awards Ceremony and graduations still happen. Perhaps it may need to wait until the start of next year, but the one thing we don't want this virus to do is to take away all of the things that we did accomplish in school this past year.

Here at school the building looks and feels like summer vacation. The hallways are mostly quiet, rooms are being cleaned, floors are being waxed, etc. That is where that comparison ends though. Some days we have looked outside to see snowflakes in the air, and the temperature is still far from summer levels. Instruction is still happening but it may be through homework teachers put together for parents to pick up or classes being held via the Internet through a program called Google Classroom. Many of the teachers have made comments about how they miss the students and miss the face-to-face interaction.

Other work here has been going on as usual. We are still in the process of looking for an 8th grade teacher for next year. As with anything else, this pandemic has had an impact on that process too. Speaking with principals throughout the North Wisconsin District, they are all struggling to fill positions that are being left vacant. A few things are causing this. First, the lack of synodically trained teachers that are looking to move or willing to move through what is happening in the world at this time. The other thing is, just as with pastors, fewer and fewer people are going into Lutheran school church work as teachers, so colleges have fewer people to offer. The search continues though, and once new news is available, we will get it to you.

Enrollment numbers for next year are looking very good at this time. We are already at 156 students enrolled for next school year, which is where we were at for most of the 2019-2020 school year. We hope to add a few more over the summer months, but praise God for what He has sent our way thus far.

We live in a stress-filled, anxiety-filled time right now. I remember though that God is always nearby watching and guarding us. It is that thought that helps many of us press on through times like these. I ask that you continue to pray for our school, teachers, staff, students, and families. Pray for peace of mind, strength when times get stressful, and continued blessings beyond what we can ever imagine.

STEWART AVENUE STEPS UPDATE—LETTER FROM PROPERTIES COMMITTEE

Stewart Avenue Steps Update

The Properties committee is very pleased with the progress made by Kulp's Roofing on the Upper Sanctuary roof, steeples, and louvers.

The next project we would like to complete is replacing the front steps that have been deteriorating for the last few years. Two years ago, we received a quote for removing the granite on the center steps, refacing the planters with brick, and replacing the steps with poured concrete. The quote for that work was about \$25,000. During discussion about the steps at a previous Voters' Meeting, there was considerable concern that we were disposing of the old granite from the steps and planters.

In February we contacted Samuels Group, a local design/build firm, to obtain a quote based on the two options we had presented to the congregation. The first being to replace the planters and all the steps with brick and concrete. The second was a patio area that would span the width of the sanctuary and extend out to the city sidewalk, about fifteen feet. We also asked them about incorporating some of the granite into the new steps. When we received the quotes, they were considerably higher than we had hoped. The quote for replacing the steps at all three doors is \$186,000, and the patio option is \$231,000. Samuels is concerned that because of the way the steps are pulling away from the building, there are not proper footings under the steps. Their quote also incorporated using some of the existing granite as risers for the steps. Because the quotes were so high, we asked them to provide a quote for replacing only the center steps, both with and without planters. The quote for the center steps only is \$70,000. The quote for the center steps with planters is \$113,000. One thing to note is that all of the quotes are assuming worst case scenario. If they find that there are proper footings beneath the existing steps, we could save several thousand dollars on each option.

We currently have about \$75,000 to be used on this project. Our goal is to have a recommendation to present to the congregation at the next Voters' Meeting, whenever that may be.

Facilities/Properties

Stay-at-home orders gently stalled the final work on the steeples and louvers, but all of the work is complete! You will notice white caps on the corners going up to the steeples. Kulp's did some research from an old photograph of Trinity and chose the white caps to complement the history of the church. The new roof should allow us to work towards repairing some of the small flaky areas on the ceiling in the Upper Sanctuary.

We are still working towards the Stewart Avenue steps repair. We have a few options to present to the congregation, but all involved tearing out existing foundation under the planters and steps to reinforce them. This is a more extensive project than what we first imagined. When we can meet again as a congregation, this project will be presented at a Voters' Meeting so that the congregation can advise us on how to move forward. Please see the note from the Properties Ministry in this newsletter for more information.

March Financial Summary

Ending the ninth month of the fiscal year, we remain at 97% of tithes and offerings budgeted. We have been so blessed by a responsive congregation through CoVID-19. You continue to support the operations of the church, which allows us to continue to serve you through different means of print, social media, and digital communication, even when we are not practicing in the building. THANK YOU for your dedication to the ministry at Trinity Lutheran Church and School.

We have been blessed by the opportunity to apply for a Small Business Administration (SBA) Payroll Protection Program (PPP) Loan. A letter was sent via mail to the congregation explaining what this means for Trinity.

We continue to work on the budget process through virtual meetings, which presents a new set of challenges. Working together without being able to meet in person is a top priority of the process. We will likely approve a budget contingent upon voter approval. Due to participation in the School Choice program, the school must have a budget approved by the Day School Ministry by June 30th. Again, this will be contingent upon voter approval at a later date.

Please pray continually for the future of Trinity – that we may be blessed to be a blessing to others in the community and beyond through a fruitful ministry to those we serve in the name of Jesus Christ (John 15:5).

Human Resources

Please continue to pray for our incredible staff. The people we have employed at or called to Trinity have continued to work where possible throughout the shutdown. Childcare staff have worked side by side with custodians. Office staff have learned new process so that they could support staff remotely. Teachers have learned how to teach without being in the presence of students. Pastors have learned how to provide Word and Sacrament ministry without being in the presence of a congregation.

Outreach

No one was prepared to work from home. We are all in the business of serving others. It would have been easy to fall apart without those to serve...and yet, we found a way to serve each other and you through different means.
