

Picture Day: Lifetouch will be here on Tuesday, October 6th first thing in the morning to take professional pictures. You will receive an email from them about ordering beforehand. All children will have their picture taken. Please dress them in what you want them to wear for their picture or talk with their teacher about a change of clothes.

School Age Care: There is no Day School on Thursday and Friday, October 29th and 30th. There will be full day school age care provided. Registration in advance is required. Registration is due by Monday, October 19th in order to staff the correct number of teachers needed for the students attending. You can either sign up on the form in the ECC classroom or email me with the care you will be needing: swansonp@trinitynet.org.

Enrollment: Working on enrolling children from the waitlist. Receiving inquiries about childcare regularly for all ages.

Hiring: We are hiring part-time assistant teachers for all classrooms and full-time lead teachers for the 4-year-old classroom and school age program. Contact Penny Swanson at 715-848-0166, ext. 348 or swansonp@trinitynet.org. **Childcare Sub-Committee:** In order to continue providing the highest quality care for our children, the Childcare Sub-Committee has voted to increase childcare tuition. This increase will be in effect starting January 4, 2021. An informational letter will be sent to families this month with more details. A staff pay raise will go into effect at the beginning of 2021. Working on making competitive wages for our childcare teachers.

SCRIP is fundraising while you shop! It is a program where a percentage goes directly to the ministries at Trinity. Another percentage goes directly to you. You can apply your rebate percentage to your childcare tuition or another ministry at Trinity. Find out more information on the Trinity website (trinitywausau.org) under the "Welcome" tab, or stop in the church office for more details.

Free Hot Lunch: Hot lunch is available for free to all Trinity students including childcare children. This has become available from the USDA and the Food and Nutrition Service. Those that purchased hot lunch from August 31st until

this went into effect will be reimbursed on their hot lunch account. See the flyer in the childcare classrooms or outside the childcare office for more details.

Parents have been pitching in to keep students that are under the weather at home to slow down the spread of any sickness here at school, and we have been doing our best to follow guidelines that are being put out by the local health department. Thanks for the efforts of everyone for doing your best to help Trinity stay open.

If it should happen that we need to close for a time, we are working to get things set up to help our teachers better serve the students at home. We recently received a device called SWIVL. This device will help our teachers livestream and record their lessons so students at home can still see what is happening in the classroom. Our hope is that these don't need to be used much, but should we need to close down for a while, we hope to be ready to keep instruction moving forward.

TRINITY HISTORY: DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know... The cornerstone to the church was laid on the First Sunday after Trinity Sunday in 1908. Traditionally churches have named their congregations according to the feast or festival day that falls closest to the setting of their cornerstone. That is most likely why our charter members chose our congregation to be named Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. Items placed inside the cornerstone were a Bible, Book of Concord, Luther's Small Catechism and a hymnal. These items were provided by Trinity's Ladies Aid and they remain in the cornerstone to this day.

What's even more remarkable is that the cornerstone would have been set on June 21st, 1908 and the sanctuary was constructed (mostly by volunteer labor) and dedicated less than five months later on November 1st, 1908... now you know!

Did you know... On January 3, 1967 the Board of Elders was presented with a drawing of a custom designed Sanctuary Lamp for our altar. It is a one of a kind design and there is not another one like it. Its purchase was quickly approved and was donated by Mr. & Mrs. John Plautz in memory of their son, Rev. James Luther Plautz, who passed away at the young age of 31 on January 28, 1966. Rev. Plautz was a son of our congregation. The lamp is sometimes called the "eternal light" because its flame is never extinguished except to change the candle once it burns down. Each candle burns for approximately seven days and then needs replacement. The candles for the lamp continue to be provided for by the Plautz family. The continuous red glow of the lamp reminds us that Christ is always present in His house, but especially, even physically, in the Lord's Supper. Our Sanctuary Lamp has

continually provided light on our altar for 53 years. ... now you know!

Facilities/Properties

The Stewart Avenue step repair began ahead of schedule in September. Completion is expected in November. While the original quote included tearing out the existing concrete and rebuilding the footings, it was determined when the project started that this wasn't necessary. There were some additional costs to the project that were not anticipated, but overall we are expecting to save about \$20,000 from the approved project cost. This is great news that will allow us to allocate resources to projects that we didn't expect to be able to complete in the foreseeable future. We are truly blessed.

We continue to carry out disinfection protocols every day after school and church to ensure the safety of our staff, students and visitors. Extra measures have also been implemented in childcare. We are using non-toxic cleaning materials when possible to reduce exposure to potentially harmful chemicals. All cleaning materials that we are using have been researched and are on record with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to kill human coronavirus according to Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines.

We have limited spaces that qualify as best practice for holding potentially sick students while they await pick-up. This is an important part of reopening the school for in-person instruction. As a result, it may be necessary to ask for scheduled activities to be flexible.

We are all excited about returning to the building. For the continued safety of our staff, parishioners and students, we are reopening in stages. We are currently focusing on ministry-specific activities, including church, Bible studies, school, childcare, and quilting. If you have questions or concerns about whether or not your activity is currently hosted at the church, please contact the Church Office, and we will get back to you as quickly as possible.

August Financial Summary

When Wausau School District made the determination to return to virtual-only classes, Trinity Lutheran School was inundated with enrollment requests at all grade levels. We were able to accommodate 28 new students. We simply did not have physical space to safely accommodate those on the waiting list. Due to this increase in enrollment, we had to update the budget, including additional income and expense, as well as using some resources in the church to accommodate the additional needs in the School.

Despite the ongoing effort to be transparent in financial reporting, we are unable to give a detailed breakdown of the financials in the Newsletter this month. This is due, in large part, to the reworking of the Chart of Accounts and additional students that we enrolled just before the start of school that required an updated budget. We are in process of updating the budget due to additional students.

Updated financial information for the first quarter will be in the November Newsletter. Until then, highlights for financials include the following:

- We are right at budget for weekly income in tithes and offerings.
- The new budget will account for some additional income with respect to additional students. However, some of this additional income is offset by the loss of 2 WPCP students that we budgeted.
- We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:
 - Endowment Loan: \$153,956
 - Thrivent Loan: \$673,690 (We paid \$50k in additional principal on this loan in June, and we are budgeted to pay additional principal every month this fiscal year!)
 - TOTAL Debt: \$827,646

Overall we should be in a good financial position to budget. Our finances are a symptom of the overall health and generosity of our congregation. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Human Resources

Due to an increase in students, we have an ongoing need for Teacher Assistants and Substitute Teachers this year in the school. If you know of someone who is interested in working at Trinity in that capacity, please ask them to reach out to Principal Zuelsdorff at 715-848-0166.

We have an ongoing need to fill staffing positions in the childcare setting. Currently we are looking for a full-time benefitted Lead Teacher in the 4 year-old classroom, as well as several part-time Teacher Assistants. Please reach out to Penny Swanson at 715-842-0769.

We have reallocated some of the hours of the pastors, DCE, and Director of Music to the school in order to continue to strive to provide our students with a top notch education with a Christ-centered approach.

Please pray for the continued health & well-being of our staff as we provide in-person services in church, childcare and school.




