# LENT

## HIS LOVE ENDURES FOREVER



#### FROM THE PASTOR...

The writer of the book of Ecclesiastes writes, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:... a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance..." (Ecc 3:1,4). These words remind me of the season we find ourselves in: the season of Lent. This season is a time of reflection on our sin and our need for a savior. This season is not to be taken lightly but reverently, deliberately and seriously. The reality is that sin ravages everything. It tears apart, wreaks havoc, and ruins creation, relationships, and even moments in our lives.

With the reality of sin, we are constantly invited to repent of our sin—to literally turn from it.

Therefore, when confronted with our sin, we ought to weep and mourn over it. As the prophet, Joel writes in Joel 2:12-13, "'Yet even now,' declares the LORD, 'return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Join with the psalmist in Psalm 38:18, "I confess my iniquity; I am sorry for my sin."

The good news is that the Lord is slow to anger and abounds in steadfast love. He doesn't leave us in our weeping and mourning. Almighty God sent His one and only Son to forgive our sins. The psalmist writes of this good news, "For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us" (Psalm 103:11-12).

As we press on through Lent, we continue our time of reflection of our sin and our need of a savior. However, we know that this season will end, and there will be a day when the somberness, reflectiveness, and the sadness of Lent turns to joy, for there will come a time to celebrate, laugh, and dance. Lent will end, and when it does, it will be Easter.

#### **Facilities/Properties**

In an effort to recover any credibility lost over the past few months over the Stewart Avenue steps project, we will refrain from saying that it will be completed by any specific time. Instead, we will say that manufacturing and weather delays have been a hindrance, but that we are confident that the finished project will have been worth the wait. The project is fully funded.

If you feel passionate about facility updates, you can continue to give to "Building Restoration," which should help fund the celling repair in the sanctuary, brick restoration along Stewart Avenue, and new carpet where necessary. We are in process of quoting the projects, and our hope would be that the ceiling project and the carpet could be completed as complementary projects, giving our Sanctuary a restorative facelift.

We continue to carry out disinfection protocols every day after school and church to insure the safety of our staff, students and visitors. Extra measures have also been implemented in childcare. We are using non-toxic cleaning materials when possible to reduce exposure to potentially harmful chemicals. All cleaning materials that we are using have been researched and are on record with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to kill human coronavirus according to Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines.

#### **January Financial Summary**

January financials are reflective of what we expected to see:

- We continue to struggle to fill vacancies in Childcare due to CoVID, which is impacting the Childcare Net Income by about \$23,000 to date (projected to have a \$40,000 variance from budget by the end of the fiscal year). Childcare income is at 51% of budget for the year, while expenses are much higher at 73% of budget for the year. This is a big financial impact, which is causing us to look at solutions that need to be in process sooner than later. We have space for more children, but have an equal struggle in filling open positions...there is an important balance of these struggles that we hope to achieve.
- We are falling 6% short of budget for tithes and offerings. This is a significant decrease in tithes and offerings from the recovery we saw in the Advent and Christmas season. In short, with less people attending church, we are seeing a dip in tithes and offerings that will likely impact our operating budget next fiscal year, meaning that we expect to have less funds to allocate to the overall ministry and must be able to account for that in spending. We are projecting a \$70,000 decrease from budget this year. That is a significant number.
- We are under budget for expenses...we continue to be good stewards of the resources we are given.
- Expenses for all wages look out of whack this month due to some adjustments that were made. If you look closely, you can see
  that the School wages are lower than budgeted and other areas are higher...that is because shared wages get allocated to the
  school at the end of the fiscal year (June). This will balance out.
- We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:
  - Endowment Loan: \$144,233
     Thrivent Loan: \$645,287
     TOTAL Debt: \$789,520
- We paid \$10,000 in January due to the generosity of our congregation and the commitment to paying down debt! We are making great progress in this area!

In contrast to the report in December, our financial outlook for this financial year is not great. We continue to be good stewards, but CoVID-19 is impacting our operations in more ways than we imagined. The future feels uncertain in the current political climate, but we are faithful that God's plan will be for Trinity to continue ministry for generations to come.

#### **PPP Loan Update** (in case you've missed this over the last couple of months):

In April, we applied for and received a Payroll Protection Program loan from the Small Business Association in the amount of \$227,600. The purpose of that "forgivable" loan was to provide relief during the Stay-At-Home period, when continued income was unpredictable. Because of the loan, we were able to continue providing income and benefits for all of our staff during that 8-week period.

We were able to apply for loan forgiveness in September. The SBA had 90 days to review our application and determine if any of our loan could be forgiven. We are so blessed! We found out in early November that 100% of our PPP Loan was forgiven, which means that we don't have to pay any of it back! Some of that money is covering the loss that we are experiencing in childcare as a result of families staying home due to lost jobs, working from home, etc. Some of the money has been spent on salaries and benefits that fell outside of the 8-week eligible expense period. Some of that money went to staff bonuses in December since we were unable to budget wage increases this year. We are in process of evaluating what portion of that money remains and how it is best served in ministry.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

#### **TRINITY HISTORY: DID YOU KNOW?**

We are going to put a couple in the newsletter each month for those who don't have Facebook or may have missed the postings. The history of our congregation is so rich and valuable. Through it we are able to see how faithful God has been to his people. It serves as a reminder that if he has been faithful to us in the past he will certainly be faithful to us in the future. Enjoy! Did you know...Following the construction of the 1925 school building enrollment continued to grow. By 1948 enrollment had climbed to over 350 students and lack of classroom space began to be an issue. When the building was built in 1925 only four classrooms were needed, but they provided for six. Thanks again to the farsightedness of the original building committee; it was possible to erect an addition above the gymnasium. To make plans for future growth heavy steel over the gymnasium ceiling was used in case a second story was ever needed. At the time it seemed like a wasted effort, but how well they built in 1925! The Oppenhamer and Obel firm again served as architects and Mr. Edmund E. Schield was chosen as general contractor. The new addition was dedicated on June 5, 1949 and provided three more classrooms, a library and other utility rooms, with a total of nine excellent classrooms in

the entire building. ... now you know!

Did you know...Shortly following the construction of the 1925 school, at a cost of \$85,000, the congregation was genuinely concerned about the financial debt that was incurred. They worked tirelessly over the ensuing years to be debt free. On January 1, 1934 the debt stood at \$33,275 with a 4% interest rate. Mr. J.H. Kleinschmidt presented a plan to solicit non-interest bearing loans from members of the congregation, the plan aiming at a loan of \$25.00 from each communicant member. Even in the midst of the Great Depression and a World War many did what they could, eventually developing an additional plan in 1939 called the "Penny-A-Meal" where each communicant member would give a penny towards paying down the debt for each meal each day. By 1942 debt stood at only \$3,565.80 and on April 12, before a happy gathering in the school auditorium, Mr. O.H. Jahns, treasurer of the congregation, handed Mr. J.H. Kleinschmidt, the last note of indebtedness on the school to which Pastor E.H. Bertermann touched a match, signifying the complete payment of the debt on the school. ...now you know!
