

FROM THE PASTOR...





Part of my vacation this year was at a beach house on Lake Erie. It provided a beautiful opportunity to sit in awe of God's creation, spend time in prayer, and get a little rest and relaxation. Looking out over Lake Erie, listening to the waves crash upon the rocks and watching boats glide across the water was quite calming. Each day was the same: peaceful on the lake.

As I was enjoying the time by the lake, I could not help but imagine what it would be like if there was a storm. The calm waters turning choppy. Boats trying to navigate to safety. Would the birds attempt to venture out to find food?

My thoughts then wandered to life and its turmoil. Life is full of turmoil. On this vacation, we had the car break down, almost got hit, big feelings among family members that needed to be navigated through, and a power outage. When life has turmoil, stress is experienced. When stress is experienced it is easy to sin. Maybe you have had an experience like me. Maybe you are going through something right now where your life is in turmoil.

As I was reflecting on my vacation experience and time at the lake, I decided to look up the word "sea" in the Bible. I was curious to see what God's word said about seas. Our Prayer Life—A Daily God-Given Opportunity

Do we often forget the God-given "Treasure" that is available to us 24 hours a day? Is prayer an optional habit in your daily life? How often do you think of praying...when you are sick or when you are worried or have personal problems to deal with or solve? I contend—prayer is not an optional habit! God commands us to pray as the Second Commandment teaches... "to call upon Him in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks." Martin Luther made an interesting statement: "Praying is the work of Christians alone; for before we are Christians and believe, we know neither for what or how we are to pray" (p. 1077, What Luther Says, Volume II). Meaningful prayer takes a faith relationship confidently believing God hears us and answers our prayers in the way He knows best for our eternal welfare, A true prayer takes a commitment in that whatever happens, we trust God's answer and actions in our lives. The bottom line is found in Acts 2:42... "They (Christians) devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." I pray that you and I daily assess the faithful use of our prayer life.

- 1. Your thumb is nearest you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is, as C. S. Lewis once said, a "sweet duty."
- 2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct, and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.
- 3. The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the President, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.
- 4. The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger, as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble, or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray enough for them.
- 5. And lastly comes our little finger—the smallest finger of all which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, "The least shall be the greatest among you." Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective and you will be able to pray for yourself more effectively.

#### **Facilities/Properties**

Restoration work on the ceiling above the balcony has been completed. This critical area over the organ pipes was repaired and will preserve the integrity of the pipes for years to come.

We are looking at a few major projects that will total over \$300,000 – these projects have been outlined in detail over the past few months in this newsletter article. We would hope to complete these in the next two years if possible. If you feel passionate about facility updates, you can give to "Building Restoration," which will help fund these upcoming projects.

#### June/End of Fiscal Year Financial Summary

June financials far exceed what we would have expected to see:

- We continue to struggle to fill staffing and student vacancies in Childcare due to CoVID, which has impacted the yearly Childcare Net Income by \$113,476 (Childcare was budgeted to lose \$60,431, but lost an additional \$53,045 unbudgeted loss at the end of the fiscal year). Childcare income ended at 54% of budget for the year, while expenses are much higher at 68% of budget for the year.
- We ended only 2% short of budget for tithes and offerings. We increased the Tithes and Offerings budget this year by 5%, so the fact that we are so close to budget (let alone during a pandemic) is truly a blessing.
- We are well under or right at budget for expenses in *all* areas...we continue to be good stewards of the resources we are given.
- We continue to pay down debt ahead of schedule. Debt is currently:
  - ◆ Endowment Loan: \$135,118
  - ♦ Thrivent Loan: \$628,274
  - ♦ TOTAL Debt: \$763,393 (This is the same as last month because I ran the report late last month and it included June's numbers. Please forgive the misprint.)

In summary, we have 4 main sources of income for general/budgeted expenses:

- Tithes and Offerings are budgeted tightly and support general operation expenses such as salaries & benefits (roughly 70% of our cost to operate, which is normal for any organization), overhead costs like utilities, computers, trash, building maintenance, etc., and consumables like paper and office supplies.
- School Tuition: Comparatively low to our Wausau parochial school counterparts but comparatively high to other Lutheran schools. All of this money supports School operational costs. Tuition does not come close to covering these costs, and we budget annually for Tithes and Offerings to support the School somewhere between \$350k and \$500k.
- School Choice payments: This is a significant dollar amount that supports school operations. This amount varies significantly year to year, and is based on the enrollment of School Choice students. School Choice (WPCP) is a State-funded program that allows students to attend private schools. Students who qualify can attend a school of their choice for free, and the public school dollars are reallocated to the school of choice.
- Childcare Tuition: Childcare tuition is budgeted to support everything in the Childcare *except* overhead expenses. These costs are supplemented by Tithes and Offerings and make up the annual budgeted loss in Childcare. Childcare is expected to and budgeted to break even outside of this budgeted loss in overhead.

This year we brought in enough Tithes and Offerings, School Tuition, and School Choice dollars to cover all budgeted costs for Church and School. We did not, however, bring in the \$53,000 that Childcare is over budget. That money ate into the excess from the PPP Loan we obtained last year. That money is now gone. If this continues, Trinity is projected to see a financial backslide that has taken years to recover from. This is a major focus of the leadership right now.

Regardless of any struggle, we have been quite blessed this fiscal year. The outlook could have been significantly different through this last year. May God continue to work within you to continue to support the ministry at Trinity. We have a lot of wonderful things in the works, and we cannot wait to share them with you! Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Did you know...Already in the mid 60's there was a desire to provide for new communion vessels for the distribution of the Lord's Supper. The vessels were to be specifically handcrafted for our congregation and not simply purchased from a catalog. Rev. Theo. G. Schoech took on the task and sought out Mr. Otto Dingeldein of Dingeldein Silversmiths in Cape Girardeau, MO. Pictures of the interior of our sanctuary were sent to him so that the vessels could be made to reflect the architecture of the chancel. Mr. Dingeldein indicated that in making the pieces he took into consideration the strong vertical lines in our structure and the tall dominant chancel wall; thus specifically designing the chalice to be tall. The chalice and the ciborium from which the wine and the bread are served, are made of silver with gold overlay. The pyx in which extra bread is stored is silver with gold lining on the inside. The chalice and ciborium also have Wausau ruby red granite inlaid in the stems for the purpose of incorporating some prominent local element representative of our locality. The granite was selected, cut and shipped to Mr. Dingeldein by Anderson Bros. & Johnson Monument Company here in Wausau. The late Ethel (Johnson) Behnke Bohl was the daughter of Julius Johnson, owner. Upon arrival the granite was not thin enough and eventually had to be sent to a gem cutter in Germany for final finishing. The chalice has the words "TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH" in large letters on one panel of the stem. On the opposite panel is the Chi Rho (XP) symbol. Chi Rho are the first letters of the Greek word for Christ. This symbol is most appropriate for vessels used in celebrating the sacrament of Christ's body and blood. The ciborium and the pyx also have the symbol as a handle on their covers. The cost of these new vessels was completely underwritten by special gifts and memorials and is a fitting memorial to fellow members who have died in the Lord. The vessels were dedicated and used for the first time on February 2, 1969. Sometime later, in the summer of 1976, Pastor Schoech once again contacted Mr. Dingeldein to have a second chalice made that would be identical to original and would be in memory of Rev. E.H. Bertermann, who served Trinity from 1919 until his passing in 1974. Although Mr. Dingeldein had drawings of the original, he suggested that we send him the chalice so he could be sure that the second one would be identical to the first. The price of silver had tripled and gold had quadrupled since, but it did not matter, special gifts and memorials to the memory of Pastor Bertermann was more than enough to cover the cost. ...now you know!

area of sacramental vessels. Commenting on his
work for us Mr.
Dingledein wrote
in a letter to Pastor Schoech,

"The making of the pieces was very difficult. There are five different thicknesses of metal on the chalice and each one worked differently in the fire when they were joined. The finishes for the lettering and the surfaces for the Chi Rho had to be produced prior to and protected throughout the entire assembly. This is about the most elegant piece I ever made."



The engraving on the bottom of the second chalice, in memory of Rev. E.H. Bertermann, was crafted to be identical to the original.
