The word *vocation* is based on the Latin word for "call". God uses this word to teach us of the role in life that He has placed upon you. "Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him. This is my rule in all the churches." (1 Corinthians 7:17). You are called to live in three estates. Vocation is your place in your <u>family</u>: son, daughter, brother sister. You are called second, to a vocation in the world or <u>society</u>: student, employee, citizen. You are called third, to a vocation in the <u>church</u>: hearer of the Word, prayer, giver, volunteer.

IDEAS OF VOCATIONAL SERVICE MIGHT BE...

- Examples of being a good son or daughter (obey/respect)
- Examples of serving your brother(s) or sister(s)
- Examples of serving your grandfather or grandmother
- Examples of serving those who are members of your family
