But I trust in you, O Lord; I say, "You are my God." ~Psalm 31:14

People usually say the more seasoned you are, the faster time flies. I know I'm not the only one typing and thinking, "Wait. It's almost the 4th of July already?!" As I type this, it is mid to late June, meaning the year is almost half over. And yes, fireworks, food, and festivities are just around the corner. 2026 has been dotted with many "America 250" events, since this year we celebrate the 250th "birthday" of this nation. From the founding of the United States, the importance of Christianity has always been recognized. The landscape in 2026 might seem like morals in general, and Christianity in particular, are under attack more than it is recognized. We used to know that America was a strong, Christian nation. Today, it might be hard to see Christianity in action. With high unrest and sharp divisions among people now, and with markers of our history being taken down each day, some may wonder if the windows and steeples of churches are the next targets.

Believe it or not, most of us carry around every day a reminder of the foundation of our nation. I realize that people don't carry cash, paper money, or even coins with them like they used to. If you can, take out a coin from your pocket or a dollar bill from your wallet, what do you see? The motto "In God We Trust." Here's a brief history of how this motto came to be. From the days of the colonies until Civil War times, coins were the only form of money. It was during the Civil War that an interest in a religious inscription on coins came to light. Many citizens and ministers wrote the Treasury expressing the opinion that by not having an inscription on coins we were disowning God and our religious heritage. Secretary of the Treasury Solomon Chase instructed the Director of the Philadelphia mint to come up with a motto for all coins used at the time, which were one-, two-, and three-cent coins. Director James Pollack came up with the 4 simple words "In God We Trust." With a March 3, 1865, act of Congress, In God We Trust was first put on the two-cent coin. With only small interruptions, that motto has appeared on all minted US coins ever since. It has appeared on all coins uninterrupted since 1916. It wasn't until a bill passed by Congress and signed by Pres. Eisenhower on July 30, 1956, that In God We Trust has appeared on all paper money printed by the Treasury. What does it mean for this country and its' people to have the words In God We Trust on all our money? I believe it means that not only are people in America still free to express their religion in an appropriate way, but they are also still free from the tyranny or oppression of others who believe differently. Not every American will be a Christian, even though we may wish all to be. Not every American will believe in a religion at all. As long as people exist, atheists and agnostics will also exist. As Christians, let us thank God that as citizens of this country we are free to proclaim with our lips and lives In God We Trust. Thank God that His Word is not bound but has free course still in America. Thank God for the opportunities He gives us to share that Word. As we celebrate the birthday of this great nation, let us not forget the religious freedom we enjoy as citizens of the United States. Let us boldly proclaim with words and actions In God We Trust.

- 4 meetings, wrapping up in mid-June
- Process:
 - ◇ Survey
 - ◆ Began Easter Sunday, lasts through 3 total Sundays
 - ◆ Gets people in the right frame of mind about identifying the identity and purpose
 - ◆ Highlights shared at Vision event on May 3
 - ◆ Final report with all details will go to Pastor Mayland

 - ◆ May 13th - Processing of sample statements and congregational language
 - ◆ The Visioning Team compiled a data base of words and phrases used by the congregation members in the Vision Event on May 3. The team then pulled specific words and phrases that repeated time and time again by members. These became the inspiration for the Guiding Statement.
 - ◆ May 21 - Finalize Guiding Statement
 - ◆ The Visioning Team met to workshop the Guiding Statement, using common words and phrases from the congregation members in the Vision Event on May 3. The final Guiding Statement is to the left.
 - ◆ June 10 - Define Mission Pillars – actionable items that guide the congregation moving forward in ministry
 - ◆ The Visioning Team met for a final time to identify the Mission Pillars. These will be used to define what we do in ministry at Trinity Lutheran Church & School over the next 5-10 years. Again, these pillars were defined using input from the congregation members who were present at the Vision Event on May 3.

Defining the Guiding Statement using words and phrases from the congregation's input at the Vision Event:

“Enduring” reflects the longevity and history at Trinity Lutheran Church & School. Our longevity and history is further defined by word the congregation used: sustaining (Isaiah 50:4), hope (Matt 24:13, James 1:12, Hebrews 10:36), abiding/lasting (Isaiah 40:6-8, 1 Peter 1:25), steadfast (James 1:2-4).

“Family” reflects that our members are united (Romans 6:5) Children of God (John 1:12, Romans 8:16, 1 John 3:1) who serve as one body with many members (1 Corinth 12:12). We are faithful households (Galatians 6:10, 1 Timothy 3:5) who honor a commitment to education (Proverbs 22:6).

“Disciples” are devoted followers (Mark 8:34-9:1, Luke 9:23-24) who abide in truth (John 8:31-32) and spread the Gospel (Matthew 28:18-20).

We **“teach”** by many methods, including worship, Bible study, and Christian education throughout the church, school and childcare.

We **“love”** through outreach/evangelism, supporting missions through financial and volunteer support, human care ministries, and partnering with families.

We **“connect”** through Word & Sacrament ministry and multi-generational education and fellowship.

“Multi-generational” is not caring for people of all ages, but also caring for people in all stages (Psalm 45:17). We come together (Hebrews 10:24-25) to build the ministry so that the next generation can flourish in faith (Genesis 9:12, 17:7, 1 Corinth 16:15) and fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2).

We engage in **“education”** in support of lifelong learning (Matt 19:14, Mark 10:13-16)...growing in spiritual maturity over time so that we may share knowledge, skills and habits. Our ultimate goal through education is to teach absolute truth (John 14:6).

To live a life of **“service”** is to be the salt and light (Matt 5:13-16), to be thoughtful stewards of God's gifts (1 Peter 4:10-11), to protect (Psalm 91:4) and to comfort (Psalm 23:4, Psalm 71:21, Isaiah 40:1, Matt 5:4) others (Galatians 5:13). A faithful servant (Mark 10:45) is what we strive to be.

In summary, our congregation worked together to define our Guiding Statement as:

May Financial Summary

In May, we were forced to migrate from Quickbooks Desktop to Quickbooks Online. While there are many enhanced features in the online version, there have been some challenges with the migration. I have figured out how to accurately run payroll, enter and pay bills, and enter deposits.

While I focused on those critical items, the reporting features have been on the back-burner. Unfortunately I cannot run accurate financials out of the new system yet, so I cannot report them here. Because we migrated in the middle of the month, I cannot run those reports from the previous system either.

I am committed to being transparent with all I do at Trinity, first and foremost the financials. At the first opportunity, I will send an email to the congregation with the updated, accurate numbers, but I am asking for your patience and grace in this area as I learn this new system.

The Rummage Sale raised roughly \$9,500! We are forever grateful to the men and women who serve and make that a success year after year. The excess of what we budgeted to raise supplied the funds for the upgraded trash receptacles in the restrooms. While that may not sound very exciting, they will last a long time and keep those spaces clean.

Human Resources

One of the items identified through the Vision Event on May 3rd was a feeling that we have a lack of volunteerism, or difficulty finding volunteers. In fact, we have a LOT of volunteers serving in LOTS of different areas. We do not always do a great job of making sure that everyone knows how and where to serve. Ministry Clarity will help us do that. Until then we would like to extend our deepest and heartfelt gratitude to those of you who serve in (at least) one area across the church, school and childcare.

FINANCIALS—MAY 2026

Facilities/Properties

We are currently working on several Facilities projects.

ELEVATOR REPAIRS

Problem:

The hydraulic cylinder is leaking fluid, likely into the ground.

This requires the elevator company to dig out the cement between the ground and the elevator, clean out the leak, and replace the cylinder.

We are currently able to keep fluid levels up by adding fluid. The elevator passes inspection because of this.

In short, this is a much-needed repair that must be done with urgency.

Expected downtime:

2 weeks, best case scenario

Could be up to 3 months if there is a major problem that requires additional work. We will not know that until they get down there.

Option 1: Otis

Quote is \$85k

Does NOT include additional costs up to \$5k for the hole closing in on itself

Does NOT include up to \$30k for potential drilling by a 3rd party company (this is where a 3-month issue lies)

Does NOT include additional costs of \$160/hr if it take longer than 1 business day to install the cylinder

Up to \$125k total

Option 2: VTE (RECOMMENDED)

Quote is \$68k

INCLUDES \$5k for hole clean-out (which we may not use...if we do not need this, we get this money back)

INCLUDES 2 days of cylinder placement and then \$80/hr after that if needed

Does NOT include up to \$30k for potential drilling by a 3rd party company (this is where a 3-month issue lies – same for both companies)

Up to \$100k total

New company, but very familiar with the equipment and trying to ethically price and build their business on that premise

Troubleshooting: We are tossing around the idea of offering valet parking during this period of no elevator, however long that might be.

The congregation voted to move forward with the recommended vendor (VTE). Work is expected to begin this fall. There is a spring under the cement pad, and it will be driest at that time. Work is expected to be completed by Thanksgiving to avoid Advent.

BATHROOMS

We have ended a partnership with Aramark/Vestis and have entered into a partnership with Bay Towel. Bay Towel is now providing paper products for the restrooms, mop heads, etc. All previous paper towel holders with continuous paper towels have been replaced with paper. The dispensers were a different size, so one of our summer projects is to patch holes and repaint restrooms.

While we understand and hear that the restrooms are not inviting, we are waiting until the Ministry Clarity process is complete to make major updates and changes, as that process will help us prioritize the many facilities updates people would like to see happen here. For now, we have upgraded to paper towels, new trash receptacles, and a fresh coat of paint. Further updates are NOT off the table, just deferred for now.

SIDEWALKS

The city did let us know they were replacing sidewalks this summer, but they did not tell us when. The work began Thursday, Jun 25 and is expected to be completed the last week of June. We apologize for the inconvenience, but Door #16 on 5th Avenue will be locked until the new sidewalks are installed and dry.

FOOD TRAILER UPDATES

Trinity is officially in the commercial food business!

In May 2026, one of our members found a 2024 food trailer for sale. The purpose of this purchase is to provide a means of fund-raising and outreach. For example, we can respond on the ground of disasters and serve food to volunteers if we can support that. Because this was feedback we received through the Ministry Clarity process that was important to our members, we were able to get encouragement and support from the Ministry Clarity Facilitator to move forward with the purchase. The member who found the trailer offered to contact the owners for information, and ultimately Council approved the purchase of the food trailer using funds from multiple church, school and childcare funding.

Funding sources included: Unrestricted Endowment Distribution: \$7,675 (Council approved); Evangelism: \$5,000 (Elders approved); Childcare Savings: \$2,000 (Tiff approved); School Savings: \$5,500 (Andrew approved); 2024-25 Legacy Funds*: \$10,000 (School Board approved); remainder in private donations and a \$6,000 in-kind donation from the seller. Total cost to Trinity was \$34,000.

*Legacy Funds were leftover after the Wi-Fi project because during install, the vendor determined that we did not need to replace cables as originally planned. There was a significant savings from the original estimate. Legacy did fund 87% of that total project, as anticipated.

We are pursuing a license that will allow us to use the food trailer to serve food to the public. This license is more extensive than the previous food trailer, as the new one is equipped with a full kitchen, heat, A/C, refrigeration, and stainless steel everything! The license we are pursuing is a Mobile Food Establishment (MFE) license.

Licensing process:

- ✓ Obtain a letter from Marathon County Parks about using their dump station. *DONE*
- ✓ Research the differences in the available licenses and meet with the health inspector for a walk through. *DONE*—Recommendations were made and requirements were given, and we are working on those...
- ✓ We have to have some specific signage in the trailer at all times. Those have been created and printed. *DONE*
- ✓ We have to have a binder with specific items in it when the trailer is in use. This has been created. *DONE*
- ✓ The current water receptacles are not big enough for the type of license we want. We are in process of replacing those and installing an RV drain set-up. The trailer is currently at King's Campers for this work after looking at several options with the Properties Committee, this was felt to be the best option. *IN PROCESS*
- ✓ We have to get an adapter for the electric. This will be done at King's as well. *IN PROCESS*
- ✓ The empty 100lb propane tank was delivered. It will be filled at King's. *IN PROCESS*
- ✓ *After those things are completed*, we will schedule the health inspector to come in for a *pre-inspection* of both the trailer *and* our kitchen. We are going to have to commercially license our kitchen to get the Mobile Food Establishment license that we want. Our kitchen will serve as a home base for the trailer, which has some added benefits (and costs).
- ✓ *After the pre-inspection*, we can apply for the Mobile Food Establishment (MFE) license.
- ✓ *Then there is an inspection of the fire suppression system and another inspection of the electrical system.*
- ✓ *Then there is another inspection by the Health Inspector.*
- ✓ *Then there is training for the people managing the internal process of booking the trailer for use/events.*
- ✓ *Then there is training for anyone who will be a "lead person" when the trailer is in use.*
- ✓ Throughout this process, we are also working on getting the insurance finalized. Our property insurance does NOT cover the trailer. It must be insured separately.
- ✓ Throughout this process, we are also writing a charter and policies for using and operating the trailer for "events."
- ✓ Something to think about...we may need a back-up generator, which we didn't consider previously. The health inspector said that it will use more power than we expect it to.

FOOD TRAILER UPDATES

Once licensing is complete and insurance is secured, we will brand the trailer as "TLC on the go." We will be using context from Ministry Clarity to insure that the branding is aligned with our mission pillars since the trailer will be used for fundraising, as well as for outreach. While we are still in process, current design proposal images are featured here.

We know everyone is excited to use the trailer, but it simply isn't Trinity-ready. We plan to have a launch event when it is, but if you miss that, we are planning to use the food trailer at Festival of the Arts in September.
